MHRT/C Certification Program Update

Domain 8 Vocational Support - Non-Academic Curriculum Train-the-Trainer

The train-the-trainer course to teach Domain 8 will be held on **June 26, 29, and 30**, via three two-hour Zoom video sessions. The **deadline to apply is June 12, 2020**. **NOTE:** Trainers must apply for and attend a separate Train-the-Trainer session for each MHRT/C domain they wish to teach, even if they have applied in the past for a different domain.

Back-to-School in the Fall

The list of approved academic programs that meet the requirements for full MHRT/C continues to expand, with the recent addition of **six new programs** at three academic institutions:

- University of Southern Maine BSW and MSW
- University of Maine Mental Health Rehabilitation Minor. This minor, previously approved as a
 Counseling minor at the University of Maine at Machias, is now also available to University of
 Maine students in a synchronous and asynchronous format
- University of Maine at Fort Kent Three accelerated online tracks: 1) Associate in Human Services with Mental Health concentration; 2) Behavioral Health MHRT/C concentration (certificate, academic option); and 3) Behavioral Health MHRT/C concentration (certificate, non-credit, non-degree option)

MHRT/C Provisional Level A and Level B Certification

There are individuals who hold a Provisional Level A or B certificate, earned under the 2009 Guidelines. As the guidelines have changed, individuals with a **Level A** certificate should reapply under the new program. This entails completing the online module "**Maine's Mental Health System 101: An Introduction**" and submitting an application, noting that an official transcript is on file with the CFL.

Those with Level B have until the expiration date on the certificate to complete the missing requirements. Options to do this include Credit for Work Experience (formerly "Waiver"), college course work, or other relevant training. If they choose to complete the remaining requirements through the existing non-academic courses (Amethyst or Newhouse Training), they must do so before June 30, 2020. After this date those courses are no longer available.
